NOW, THEREFORE, AFTER DUE CONSIDERATION, IT IS HEREBY

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Owasco hereby approves and enacts Local Law No. 1 of 2022 Board of Ethics Membership to amend Town Code Section 11-18 (A) to change the number of members of the Town of Owasco Board of Ethics from three (3) members to five (5) members. Said Local Law is set forth below:

LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2022 BOARD OF ETHICS MEMBERSHIP

The Owasco Town Code § 11-18 A. is amended to read as follows:

§ 11-18. Board of Ethics.

A. There is hereby established a Board of Ethics for the municipality. The Board of Ethics shall consist of five members, a majority of whom shall not be officers or employees of the municipality, but at least one of whom must be a municipal officer or employee. The members of such Board of Ethics shall be appointed by the Town Board of the Town of Owasco, serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority and receive no salary or compensation for their services as members of the Board of Ethics.

Effective Date: This local law will take effect immediately on filing with the New York State Secretary of State.
