WHEREAS, on or about 9.30.21, the Town of Owasco sent a letter and Part 1 of a Full Environmental Assessment Form (FEAF) to other potentially "Interested Agencies" and "Involved Agencies" as identified in **Resolution 21-134** (as these terms are defined in the SEQRA Regulations found at 6 NYCRR Part 617.2), indicating the Town's desire to serve as the "Lead Agency" (as this quoted term is defined in the SEQRA Regulations) and to complete a coordinated review of the Project (in accordance with 6 NYCRR Part 617.6);

WHEREAS, responses from Interested and Involved Agencies were requested, and each of the potentially Interested and Involved Agencies has agreed to, or raised no objections to, or did not respond to the Town of Owasco Town Board serving as Lead Agency for the Project;

WHEREAS, on this date the Town Board reviewed Part 2 and Part 3 of the Full Environmental Assessment Form as completed by the Town Engineer and Part 3 Supporting Information dated November 2021 (18 pages) prepared by the Town Engineer, Barton & Loguidice, D.P.C.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the SEQRA Regulations, the Town of Owasco Town Board has considered the significance of the potential environmental impacts of the Project by (a) using the criteria specified in Section 617.7 of the SEQRA Regulations, and (b) examining the FEAF for the Project, including the facts and conclusions in Parts 1, 2 and 3 of the FEAF, together with other available supporting information, to identify the relevant areas of environmental concern.

RESOLUTION 21-162 BOND RESOLUTION DATED NOVEMBER 10, 2021

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF OWASCO, NEW YORK, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,300,000 SERIAL BONDS TO FINANCE THE COST OF TOWN OF OWASCO SEWER DISTRICT NO. 1 IMPROVEMENTS.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Owasco, Cayuga County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Town of Owasco, New York (the "Town") hereby approves the acquisition, construction and installation of improvements to the Town of Owasco Sewer District No. 1, including but not limited to, the replacement or rehabilitation of sewer mains, manholes, pump stations and other facilities, and the acquisition of machinery, equipment or apparatus required in connection therewith, is hereby authorized at an estimated maximum cost of \$3,300,000.

<u>Section 2</u>. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose to be financed by the Town is \$3,300,000, said amount is hereby appropriated therefor and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of the issuance of \$3,300,000 in serial bonds (the "Bonds") of the Town which are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution and the provisions of the Local Finance Law; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that to the extent that any Federal or State grants are received for such specific objects or purposes, the amount of Bonds to be issued pursuant to this Resolution shall be reduced dollar for dollar.

<u>Section 3</u>. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is forty (40) years pursuant to subparagraph 4 of Section 11.00(a) of the Local Finance Law. The proposed maturity of the Bonds will be in excess of five years.

<u>Section 4</u>. Pursuant to Section 107.00(d)(3)(l) of the Local Finance Law, current funds are not required to be provided prior to issuance of the Bonds or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of issuance of the Bonds.

<u>Section 5</u>. The temporary use of available funds of the Town, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this resolution.

<u>Section 6</u>. The Bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and the Bonds, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds, shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the real property within the Town without legal or constitutional limitation as to rate or amount. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be apportioned and assessed upon the several lots and parcels of land within the Town of Owasco Sewer District No. 1, which the Town Board shall determine and specify to be especially benefited by the capital purpose described in Section 1 of this resolution, an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest issued in anticipation of the Bonds, as the same becomes due and payable, but if not paid from such source, all the taxable real property in the Town shall be subject to the levy of ad valorem taxes without limitation as to rate or amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations.

<u>Section 7</u>. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 21.00, 30.00, 50.00 and 56.00 to 63.00 inclusive of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the Bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, and the power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of the Bonds, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds, and the power to sell and deliver the Bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds, and the power to sell and deliver the Bonds and any bond anticipation notes providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, is hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

<u>Section 8</u>. The reasonably expected source of funds to be used to initially pay for the expenditures authorized by Section 1 of this resolution shall be from the Town's General Fund. It is intended that the Town shall then reimburse such expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this resolution and that the interest payable on the Bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. This resolution is intended to constitute the declaration of the Town's "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this resolution with the proceeds of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by United States Treasury Department Regulation 1.150-2.

<u>Section 9</u>. The serial bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized to be issued by this resolution are hereby authorized to be consolidated, at the option of the Town Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer, with the serial bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by other bond resolutions previously or heretofore adopted by the Town Board for purposes of sale in one or more bond or note issues aggregating an amount not to exceed the amount authorized in such resolutions. All maters regarding the sale of the bonds, including the dated date of the bonds, the consolidation of the serial bonds and the bond anticipation notes with other issues of the Town and the serial maturities of the bonds are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.
