#### **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:**

• Mr. John Cummings would like to address the board regarding street parking concern:

John & Judy Cummings addressed the board regarding off street parking especially on the narrow avenues in the town. They live on French Ave and have a neighbor that continually has guest that park directly behind their driveway making it difficult to back out of their residents. The difficulty led to their son hitting a car on the road behind their driveway. They asked the town to adjust the off street parking rules.

Resolved: Supervisor Wagner will call the resident mentioned above whose guest park behind the drive way to ask that they be considerate to neighbors. The town board will also look into the towns parking ordinance to see if adjustments can be reasonably made.

Doris & Fred Lindsay address the board with Sewer District #3 Concerns:

Mr. & Mrs. Lindsay address the board regarding the town's new sewer district, they feel as they have a septic system that is great and away from the lake along with the fact that they voted against the sewer expansion they should be excluded from the project. They are asking the board to reconsider them from the district.

Resolved: Supervisor Wagner explained the Mr. & Mrs. Lindsay that once a district is defined then all parcels in that district must be included. Supervisor Wagner also stated that it is their choice to not connect to the system, however if they are to ever sell the property or request a building permit it must be connected within 180 days at their own expense. Supervisor Wagner also told the Lindsay's that there are approximately 180 residents in the district and they are the only ones choosing not to connect.

Town Attorney Riccardo Galbato also added that this was a public vote, and there is no way to unbind a parcel.

# TOWN OF OWASCO RESOLUTION SUPPORTING INCREASED EFFORTS TO ELIMINATE HARMFUL ALGAL BLOOMS AND ACCELERATE WATERSHED RESTORATION EFFORTS WITHIN OWASCO LAKE, ITS WATERSHED AND OTHER COUNTY WATER RESOURCES

**WHEREAS,** the Town of Owasco provides drinking water to approximately 3,000 residents in the Town of Owasco and an additional 1,800 residents in the Town of Fleming; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Auburn provides drinking water to approximately 27,000 residents in the City of Auburn and approximately 16,000 additional residents in the Towns of Sennett, Fleming, Throop, Brutus, Mentz, Montezuma, Springport and Aurelius and the Villages of Cayuga, Port Byron and Weedsport, serving an approximate total population of 43,000 residents in Cayuga County; and

WHEREAS, the relative water quality or condition of lakes are largely dictated by the quantity of critical nutrients delivered to them by the surrounding watershed, and within the 205 square mile Owasco Lake Watershed, human activities have resulted in increased nutrient loads resulting in cultural eutrophication and significant declines in Owasco Lake water quality, contributing to the increased occurrence of algal blooms; and

WHEREAS, a research report titled 2008 COMPUTER-BASED SIMULATION OF LOADS AND WATER QUALITY RESPONSES WITHIN THE OWASCO LAKE WATERSHED by Barry M. Evans, Ph.D. of Penn State University ("Evans Study") researched the nutrient (phosphorus) loads delivered to Owasco Lake from multiple sources estimated that over seventy percent (70%) of nutrient loads to Owasco Lake are from agricultural sources, clearly highlighting the need to deploy appropriate and proactive responses to address the source loading from agriculture as well as all other sources of nutrient loading; and

- **WHEREAS,** immediate short-term efforts to protect the health and safety of community residents, as well as the economic fabric of the shoreline and watershed towns and sustained long-term efforts to address the underlying water quality problems in Owasco Lake and it's 205 square mile watershed are essential to address this public health concern; and
- **WHEREAS**, in 1974 Congress passed the Safe Drinking Water Act, which requires the United State Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to determine the level of contaminants in drinking water at which no adverse health effects are likely to occur; and
- **WHEREAS**, in 1998 New York State has classified Owasco Lake as a Class AA(T) impaired waterbody; and
- **WHEREAS**, pursuant to section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act, states must consider the development of a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) or other strategy to reduce the input of the specific pollutant(s) that restrict waterbody uses, in order to restore and protect Impaired Waterbodies; and
- **WHEREAS**, a TMDL has not been developed, adopted, nor implemented for Owasco Lake to date; and
- **WHEREAS**, in late September and early October 2016 cyanotoxins from blue-green algae or cyanobacteria have been detected in the treated drinking water drawn from Owasco Lake and supplied to the public; and
- WHEREAS, the Town of Owasco along with the city of Auburn and Cayuga County Legislators is eager for the New York State Department of Health (DOH) to undertake a study in order to determine how drinking water drawn from Owasco Lake can be treated using the Best Available Technology (BAT) in order to minimize the presence of toxins associated with cyanotoxins; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Town of Owasco along with the city of Auburn and Cayuga County Legislators is eager for New York State and the US EPA to make a conclusive determination of the genesis of the blue-green algae and cyanobacteria; and
- **WHEREAS**, scientific research of Owasco Lake's impairment has linked the presence of harmful algal blooms to excessive levels of the nutrients; and
- **WHEREAS**, the EPA concluded excess nutrients are thought to be a primary driver of cyanobacterial blooms and long-term prevention of cyanobacterial blooms likely requires reductions in nutrient pollution; and
- WHEREAS, the EPA suggests Public Water Supplies (PWS) consider land use information in the source watershed as part of the system-specific evaluation. Certain land

uses are more closely linked to cyanotoxin occurrence, particularly those that result in excess nutrient discharges; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2015 the EPA cited another study that found strong associations between agricultural land cover and microcystins occurrence in three ecoregions; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Owasco Town Board does hereby request that the Governor develop, adopt, and implement a TMDL for Owasco Lake; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** while the TMDL is being created, improved water treatment for both the Owasco and City of Auburn's water system be implemented as soon as practicable at no cost to the public since ratepayers should not bear the financial burden of treating their water to eliminate pollution hazards that they did not generate and which New York State long failed to resolve as required by law; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the Owasco Town Board requests that the New York State Department of Conservation (DEC) and Department of Health (DOH) cooperate fully with EPA to fulfill the right of local residents to receive safe, clean drinking water free of cyanotoxins and all other contaminants that threaten public health by reducing nutrient loading into Owasco Lake.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Owasco Town Clerk forward certified copies of this Resolution to the Governor, the Commissioner of the DOH, and the Commissioner of the DEC.
